

Must See in Montgomery



Alabama State Capitol

Tour one of the most historic State Capitol buildings in the world! Stand on the spot where Jefferson Davis was inaugurated President of the Confederacy. This is the exact same location where the Selma-to-Montgomery March ended and Civil Rights were born.



Rosa Parks Library & Museum and Children's Wing/TROY University

This fascinating interactive museum is dedicated to Rosa Parks, a courageous seamstress, who sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott in 1955. The Museum features a recreated street scene and replica bus, while video footage transports witnesses to the fateful day.



First White House of the Confederacy

Enjoy a guided tour of the home where Jefferson Davis lived at the birth of the Confederacy. The entire house reflects the period in which it stood as the headquarters for the Confederacy including many authentic artifacts used by Davis and his family.



Old Alabama Town

Costumed interpreters guide you through life in the 19th and early 20th centuries in this fascinating 4-block "town" within the city. Visit over 40 buildings from a schoolhouse to a cotton gin and experience life as an Alabamian in the state's infancy.



Hank Williams Museum & Memorial

The music of this legendary singer and songwriter will haunt you long after your visit here. See the car he rode in on the day he died, hear his music, watch the videos, and learn about the man behind the legend. Minutes away, pay your respects at Hank's final resting place in Oakwood Cemetery.



Hyundai Motor Manufacturing Plant

Take a driving tour of the 2-million square foot manufacturing plant that resides on 1,744 acres of land and includes a stamping facility, paint shop, vehicle assembly shop, a two-mile test track and an engine shop, where the all-new Hyundai 3.3-liter V6 engine is produced.

Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church & Parsonage

Visit the church where Dr. King preached the philosophy of peaceful revolution and the parsonage where he lived with his family. Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church became a gathering place where African Americans first dared to think of equality as reality.



Alabama Shakespeare Festival

This internationally acclaimed theatre located in Blount Cultural Park will be sure to wow you! It is one of the ten largest Shakespeare Theatres in the world and presents world-class contemporary and classic productions, and educational programs throughout the year.



Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts

Every visitor to Montgomery must take time to see this permanent collection of artwork, which includes examples of 19th and 20th century American paintings and sculptures, plus a host of Southern regional art that defines the Southern culture.



Montgomery Zoo & Mann Wildlife Museum

Lions and Tigers and Bears, Oh My! Stroll along the shaded walkways and see more than 500 exotic animals in natural settings. For an interactive learning experience, the Mann Wildlife Museum features life-like exhibits of naturally preserved animals and their habitats.



Civil Rights Memorial & Center

Experience a moving tribute to those soldiers of the Civil Rights movement who gave their lives for freedom. Designed by Maya Lin, this touching tribute is a solemn reminder of the price we all pay for equality.



Alabama Department of Archives and History

Just seeing this tremendous historic building is a treat! Explore the history of Alabama through an extensive collection of portraits, memorabilia, documents and artifacts. Children will enjoy hands-on play in "Grandma's Attic."
